Greetings Friends and Supporters of Madonna Place

We want to extend our heartfelt gratitude for your generous support and commitment to our mission - which has profoundly impacted the communities we serve. Support from our federal and state funders, local foundations and businesses, community partners, donors, Board members, volunteers and employees helped us reach more families.

Last year (July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024) our four programs expanded services and supported 26% more families in Eastern CT. A total of 851 families were served (1,454 children and 934 adults) compared to 678 families served the prior fiscal year.

Our outreach efforts are provided in 3 languages: English, Spanish, and Haitian Creole. Our cultural sensitivity provides essential services to more families in need. These efforts have helped us reach more individuals in need and fostered a sense of

hope and empowerment within our community.

The Family Support Center increased food, diapers and baby formula distribution, and supported families with ESL classes and child development screenings. Our Fatherhood Initiative Program successfully received re-certification from the Department of Social Services (the only certified Fatherhood program in Eastern CT), and services expanded to support previously incarcerated fathers. Great Beginnings increased the number of families served and almost doubled the number of home visits provided in Eastern CT. COPE built collaborative relationships with partnering agencies and supported some of our highest-need clients (substance use, mental health diagnoses, domestic violence, and/or homelessness).

Madonna Place strengthened our relationships with several agencies that provided services at our facility: Norwich Adult Education, OIC, Career Resources, the Jewish Federation of Eastern CT, UCFS, and Generations.



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Great Beginnings (GB) is a weekly home visiting program for caregivers who are expecting or have a baby within their first three months of age. The program provides parent education in child development utilizing the Parents as Teachers curriculum and the Healthy Families America national model. We support families in navigating stressors and accessing necessary resources so they can focus on raising healthy children. GB is a true early intervention-based child abuse and neglect prevention program. Weekly home visits are conducted, and learning materials, books, formula, diapers, and other support resources are made available to empower families and improve access to care. Services are available in English, Spanish, and Haitian Creole.

Great Beginnings:

298 parents and children were served

1,479 home visits were completed

100% of families enrolled had no new substantiated cases of child abuse or neglect

100% of babies born during the program were healthy and full term

13 events were provided to support parent education



Community Outreach Plus Education

Community Outreach Plus Education (COPE) is a community outreach and drop-in service program that includes assessments, case management, and referrals for mental health, substance use disorders, basic needs, educational programs, and other emergency supports. Care is provided with a trauma-informed focus for mental health, substance use, and domestic violence issues. COPE provides a proactive approach of early intervention to help prevent crisis situations from escalating.

Community Outreach Plus Education:

243 parents and children in crisis were connected to services

26 families were screened for substance use or mental health issues

19% of heads of households served struggle with substance use

65% of heads of households served struggle with mental health issues

23% of the families served needed food

26% of families served suffered from domestic violence



Family Support Center

The Family Support Center (FSC) is a unique drop-in center that provides basic needs items such as diapers, baby formula, food, school supplies, toiletries, books, educational toys and resources. We offer informal counseling and parent education including ESL classes, Family-Group Connections events and Summer Connections for students. Services are offered in English, Spanish, Portuguese, and Cape Verdean Creole. The FSC helps families to reduce risk factors and build protective factors which can strengthen families, improve outcomes, and prevent child abuse and neglect.

Family Support Center:

1,954 parents and children were served

369 families received emergency diapers.

9,174 meals were served, which was 37,981 pounds of food

205 families received emergency cans of formula

143 children were assessed for developmental delays and referred for necessary services

156 ESL classes were provided for parents

Fatherhood Initiative

The purpose of the **Fatherhood Initiative** Program (FIP) is to increase positive involvement and interaction between fathers and their children. Services that we offer include the 12week 24/7 Dad and InsideOut Dad Fatherhood classes, individualized case management, support around court processes, facilitating groups with fathers currently incarcerated, and support for fathers who are involved with DCF. Case managers work with fathers to help them achieve their personal goals of increasing parenting time, modifying or establishing visitation or custody, gaining or increasing employment, and increasing parenting skills. We can also help with child support arrearage adjustment and establishing paternity. Currently Madonna Place's Fatherhood Program is the only state certified fatherhood program in Eastern CT.

Fatherhood Initiative:

298 parents and children were served

60% increased time with their children

86% of fathers served maintained employment for at least 90 days

51% of fathers increased parenting knowledge through 24/7 Dad classes

65 fathers who were previously incarcerated received support

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We all do better when families in our community are succeeding. But when times get tough, where do families turn for assistance? The non-profit community is always here to help. But not one agency or program alone can meet all the needs exhibited in the community. Together with our funders and volunteers, non-profits rally to provide programs which strengthen the safety net that has been created community-wide for supporting families and helping communities thrive. Madonna Place has worked hard this past year to increase and strengthen collaboration across all sectors

with partners offering family support, including areas like housing, parenting education, home visiting, fatherhood, economic self-sufficiency, transportation, food security, mental health, basic needs, domestic violence, employment, and more. We created new shared initiatives and outreach opportunities on-site with our partners which have transformed our collective work to allow for more holistic services and eliminated duplication. We value this work and will continue enriching these partnerships which include collaborating with



organizations like Reliance Health, OIC. Norwich Adult Education. UCFS, Safe Futures, Hartford Health Care. Generations Mobile Health Hub. Eastern CT Health Collaborative, TVCCA, SCADD, United Way of SECT, Career Resources, the Jewish Federation of Eastern CT, Always Home, Community of Hope, and more. Without these collaborative efforts we would not have been able to offer the full slate of wrap-around services that our diverse families require to improve their overall life situations. We thank all our funders, volunteers, and agency partners for their collaborative support last year and look forward to expanding our work together in the coming year.

It is hard to know what the next year will bring, but one thing we can be sure of: as a community, we are always "Stronger Together."
